Dear Friends,

For the Winter/Spring term of Wonderful Wednesdays, our Adult Bible Study is devoted to the last book of the Bible, Revelation. Revelation is certainly an often misunderstood book and has frequently been misused as a fortune-teller that predicts the future. Many people seem to think that Revelation is like a secret code, and those who can break the code will know the secrets of the future.

However, this is a terrible misreading of Revelation. The writer of Revelation tells us from the outset what the book is about: "The revelation of Jesus Christ..." (1:1). Revelation is a book that was written to give encouragement and hope to a people struggling with life's big and small challenges. The fundamental message of the book of Revelation is that we know what the future holds because we know who holds the future. Here's what Revelation says about Jesus: [He] loves us and freed us from our sins by his blood, and made us to be a kingdom...." This is what we know about the one who stands before us and calls us into the future—not that he is one to be feared, but one to be worshiped and adored because of his great love for us all.

Although Revelation continues to offer challenges to the one who would read and study it, the fundamental message is clear: our lives—past, present and future—have been, and ever will be, in the hands of a loving God. Thanks be to God.

40 days. That's the length of the season of Lent. From Ash Wednesday to Easter, we will together be observing this "journey to the cross" that has remained a meaningful part of Christian life for centuries. Traditionally speaking, Lent is a time focused on the preparation of the believer through prayer, penitence, almsgiving, and self-denial. For this reason, many Christians choose to observe Lent by devoting more time to prayer, reflecting on their experiences, beliefs, and behaviors, giving away money or possessions, and "giving up" parts of their lives that hinder their wellbeing or spiritual growth. You, of course, are encouraged to observe these practices throughout the season of Lent. This year, however, you have the opportunity to share your journey to the cross with others at Philadelphia.

In the weeks leading up to Ash Wednesday, we will be publishing a devotional booklet for the season of Lent entitled *40 Days*. This booklet is intended to help you reflect on your life and your gifts, so that by the time Easter arrives you'll hopefully have a clearer understanding of how God is calling you to be involved in the church. Together we believe that each one of us is uniquely gifted to serve Christ in some way. As you follow along in our *40 Days* booklet, please prayerfully consider your ministry during this season of Lent, and take the opportunity to make a commitment of involvement at Easter. It is our hope that by using the devotional booklet for the 40 days of Lent to help you pray and reflect, it will serve as a spiritual catalyst both personally and collectively.

Together, let's pray that these upcoming 40 days may be the richest and most fulfilling in the life of our church as we discover a call for our lives and deeper significance as followers of Jesus Christ.
