Dear Friends,

Failure.

The 3M Company is known for Scotch Tape. But that's not all they make; they are the one of the largest manufacturers of all kinds of industrial adhesives (the goo that sticks the sand to the sandpaper, for example). Some years ago the 3M chemists were working on new adhesives and came up with one that didn't work very well. It was a failure; it just didn't stick very well. So they shelved the project and moved on. A few years later a 3M engineer singing in a Presbyterian church choir was irritated by the way notes and scraps of paper were always falling out of hymnals and music as the choir sang. He went to work to see what could be done and found exactly what he needed: behold, an adhesive that doesn't stick very well. And out of that product failure came Post-It notes—a multi-million dollar industry. An adhesive that doesn't stick very well: failure. An adhesive that doesn't stick very well: success!

Sometimes what appears at first to be a failure turns out to have a value that we couldn't see at the time. I think that we can see this happening in our lives all the time. We make a decision, only to come to the conclusion that the decision was a mistake. We kick ourselves for our failure, our mistake, our bad judgment. But out of that failure, mistake, bad judgment we grow. One of the promises of scripture is: "We know that in all things God works for good in the lives of those who love him" (Romans 8:28). In ALL things God works for good. Even in events that we may think of as failures, God is able to accomplish God's good will. Thanks be to God for God's blessings in all things.

On Sunday, September 19th, we'll celebrate Homecoming. We'll see old familiar faces, rejoice in remembering where God has led us in the past, and also enjoy food and fellowship with a Philafeast after worship. But we'll also do something new: celebrate our Scottish heritage with a Kirkin' of the Tartan.

The Kirkin' o' The Tartan has its origins in the eighteenth century. After Scottish patriots were defeated at the battle of Culloden in 1745, the British Parliament passed the Parliamentary Act of 1746 which banned the kilt and every other tartan garment in an effort to destroy Highland Clan identity. Not easily deterred, the defiant Scots secretly carried remnants of their tartans to church. The ministers would then add a blessing into the service for the tartans and the clans they represented.

The Kirkin' of the Tartan worship service was revived in 1941, when Rev. Dr. Peter Marshall, originally from Scotland, held prayer services to raise money for British war relief. After he preached a sermon entitled, "The Kirkin' o' the Tartans," a tradition was born. Many Presbyterians now celebrate it with a special worship service that emphasizes our denomination's Scottish roots. Much of what we believe and do as Presbyterians arose from the life of the church in Scotland, and we owe a great deal of our worship and theology to that tradition and history.

So, on Homecoming this year we'll be carrying our tartans high. Some of us will be wearing kilts. If you're interested in participating or if you'd simply like to discover your family's tartan, let us know (we'll probably just put you in touch with Judy Jones, who is very knowledgeable on the subject!). Our hope is that it will be a fitting celebration not just of family roots, but church roots as well!
