### From Lee Koontz, Associate Pastor

I celebrate what God is doing here at Philadelphia.

I celebrate the children who come here to learn, laugh, play, and worship. I celebrate those who call this place home, and relentlessly build this place up with their time, their energy, and their prayers. I celebrate the young and the old, the members who are new and not-so-new, the Sunday School classes and the Wonderful Wednesdays. ## HELP US CurePSP

### Running In Memory Of Marla Louise Culp 1946-2009 A True Champion...

One Saturday afternoon in late November 2009, I went to visit my mother. She was lying in her bed with her eyes closed, but I know she wasn't asleep. I sat on the edge of her bed and held her hand and talked to her. This is what I said, "I'm so sorry that this has happened to you. You are the best Mother anyone could ever have and we love you very much, but if you don't want to do this anymore, it's okay. We will be alright."

Four hours later, Marla Louise Culp-the strongest woman I will ever know, passed away.

#### Our Story

For as long as I can remember, it was just the three of us – my mother, my brother and me. My mother is Marla Louise Culp. I say "is" because she will forever be a part of me. She passed away from PSP on November 21, 2009 at the age of 63. She "is", undoubtedly, the strongest person I will ever know.

Marla was a single parent by the time I was five years old. My brother, Brendan was 3 ½. Marla was 29. Life was hard as she was a second grade school teacher working full time and trying to raise two little kids. We never had much money, but, I don't remember ever not having what I needed. Marla went back to night school, juggling this commitment with the obligations of being a teacher and single parent in an effort to improve her family's well being. Her hard work paid off as she was able to secure a more lucrative job and spent the remainder of her career employed by a very reputable financial institution working her way up the corporate ladder. She retired at 61 years old.

About a year before she retired, things began to change; albeit subtle at first. She began feeling stiffness in her neck and she shuffled her feet when she walked. She was diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease. Not letting this get her down she read everything she could about Parkinson's. She attended seminars about the disease and was determined to live life to the fullest. She was active with her church and took up knitting. She walked her dog everyday and planned trips with her best friend. My mother radiated positivity.

In July 2008, one year after her retirement, Marla began falling. She started to forget things and her eyes looked funny. One day, she fell five times and called me in a panic. She had kept the previous falls from both me and Brendan. Only as a mother could, I'm sure she didn't want her children to worry. We immediately took her to the neurologist. Based on what he observed that day, Marla's diagnosis was changed from Parkinson's to Progressive Supranuclear Palsy.

Over the next year, Brendan and I took care of our mother. I lost count of how many times she fell. There were multiple trips to the hospital, many infections and violent behavior episodes. Sometimes, she didn't know who I was. It seemed as soon as we came to grips with one progression, another one was taking place right before our eyes. We could never catch up with controlling this disease. Marla could no longer walk, feed herself, dress herself or do anything herself for that matter. She eventually stopped talking and just stared blankly. By November 2009, she was under Hospice care and had developed aspiration pneumonia. Sixteen months following her PSP diagnosis.

PSP is a terrible disease. It is relentless and unforgiving. It robs the patient of their independence and dignity. It not only affects their physical body, but their mind as well and it is heart breaking to watch.

Brendan Barr is *running with a purpose* in the Marine Corps Marathon on October 30, 2011 in Washington, DC. He is running in memory of Marla Louise Culp – A True Champion. #### CurePSP

PSP (Progressive Supranuclear Palsy) is a neurodegenerative brain disease that causes the brain cells to cumulatively break down for unclear reasons. PSP affects the cells that control walking, balance, mobility, vision, speech, swallowing and behavior. Five to six people per 100,000 have PSP, however, only approximately one third of these receive a correct diagnosis. PSP has no known geographical, occupational or racial preference and, to this date, there is no cure.

CurePSP is a non-profit organization that is not only searching for a cure, but also offers knowledge and assistance to caregivers of people afflicted with PSP. PSP sufferers have such a broad spectrum of symptoms, it makes their care extremely complex and PSP offers much needed guidance and support. They also hold conferences with speakers, webinars, support groups and a website full of valuable information. Most importantly, all of these things offer comfort to the ones watching this horrible disease do its damage on their loved one.

**Where:** Pine Lake Country Club

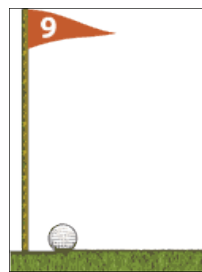
**When:** Monday, October 24, shotgun start at 11:00 a.m., registration at 10:00.
