From Lee Koontz, Associate Pastor

I want to thank all of you who have expressed your sympathy after the recent death of my grandmother. It meant a great deal to me to receive compassionate words and caring gestures during that time, and it reaffirmed my conviction that caring for each other is something that Philadelphia does very, very well. Thank you.

There were a number of people who also expressed regret over the fact that I had to lead worship the day after the funeral, but the truth is that I was exactly where I needed to be. Heather and I both felt strongly that in our time of sadness we very much needed to be with our church family. It was a relief and a comfort to worship together with our brothers and sisters in Christ, and we wouldn't have wanted to be anywhere else. Generally speaking, worship on Sunday mornings is not "work" to me. Yes, it requires a great deal of forethought and preparation time, but once we begin our worship together, that's what it is to me - worship. If it ever feels more like work than worship, I'll have a pretty clear indication that I need to reassess my priorities (or just take some time off!). My hope is that you feel that way, too. I hope that your church family at Philadelphia is a blessing and a comfort to you when times are hard. I also hope that worship on Sunday mornings is truly worshipful to you, and that you feel that church is simply a place where you need to be.

I'm interested in hearing from as many of you that care to reply about what Philadelphia means to you. How would you describe our church? What has it meant in your life and the life of our community? What would you say about it if you were speaking about it to someone who had never heard of PPC? I'm asking because I genuinely want to know. Over the last 12 months, Samaritan House has provided service to 197 people at savings of \$9.1 million in indigent care. 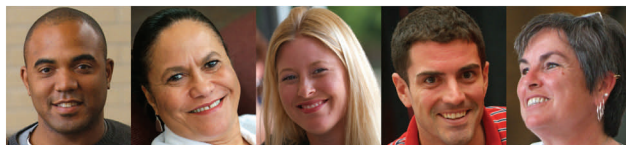
